Unlike practitioner-oriented Ed.D. programs, Chapman's Ph.D. in Education emphasizes research and data-driven decision making to further the field of Education. Candidates gain university teaching experience by team-teaching alongside Chapman faculty in graduate and credential programs.

The program's low student-to-faculty ratio and small class size (3 to 6 students within specializations) delivers on Chapman's commitment to personalizing education through intensive interaction with faculty, one-on-one advising, and mentorship.
